DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Praise Has No Color was conceived in a dream, pretty much like all of my productions. After Hurricane Katrina, me and my family moved to Atlanta and started attending a mixed church and all of my life I only attended an all black church.

I have always sang in the choir as well and was very excited to join the choir, but it was definitely an eye opener for me— the songs were very different and the praise and worship was very calm. To be honest I did not like it, but I had a dream and the holy spirit quicken me and said it's all about love and God; we just praise differently, while subconsciously infusing experiences from hurricane Katrina, and a very serious issue the country has been facing for years... racism... and thought I'll add a few culture scenes that each race may be a little curious about.

The big picture or purpose behind writing and directing *Praise Has No Color* is that we all may be different on the outside, but that should not stop us from having UNITY, LOVE, and RESPECT for each other.

Faye Childs

Faye Childs was born in Jackson Ms. but raised in New Orleans. Her mother Stella Cameron moved when Faye was 5 years old. They resided there until Hurricane Katrina. The family evacuated to Mississippi and due to conditions of New Orleans, they decided to make Mississippi their home. After staying for three years, Faye and her husband Todd Childs decided to take their production gifts to another level and moved to Atlanta, Georgia where they currently live.

Faye began writing plays in church for every major holiday; once attending her first professional play at the Saenger Theater in New Orleans, she said to herself, "I can do this!" And, that's just what happened... Faye directed, produced and starred in **Don't Wanna Play House No More** and **Lies Lust And Betrayal**.

Faye expresses that writing plays is her joy and she is grateful that God has blessed her with this gift stating, "Once I get a title or subject in my mind it's on; it's like a songwriter flowing with their lyrics. The script comes to me line after line. The characters I've created literally come to life through me— I become that character."

Faye also stated that this is one of the best careers anyone could ever have: "You are on stage or behind the camera having fun, getting a message across to God's People and getting your praise on all at one time... I love it!"

In 2008 when Faye moved to Atlanta, she connected with a Cinematographer who asked her to write a movie, which she had never done before but still said yes: "I was scared but in my mind I knew I could do it, so I actually went home, picked a movie to watch, and I watched it in detail and I did it." Her first short film was **Covered By His Blood** and now has completed her big baby, **Praise Has No Color.**


DAWN GRAHAM / STELLA

PRODUCER NOTES


Although *Praise Has No Color* is an inspirational faith based movie, it is real and raw and fits comfortably in the drama and action genres as well.


